YOU ELECTED ED KOCH BECAUSE..

- ▶ He fought to save tenants from rent increases and from eviction for demolition throughout Greenwich Village.
- ▶ He was a founder and co-chairman of the Park-on-the-Pier Committee and helped establish a city recreation area on the local Gansevoort Pier.
- ▶ He served as mediator between a local Howard Johnson's restaurant and the local chapter of NAACP and established a standard for successful solution of integration problems.
- ▶ As a member of the Borough President's Local Planning Board #2, he has proved sensitive to the community's needs and has been creative in solving its problems.
- ▶ He helped organize the campaign that saved the Bleecker Street push-carts from a city proposal to outlaw them.
- ▶ He won from the City a promise for middle-income housing on Downing and Carmine Streets and plans are currently being devised.

RE-ELECT ED KOCH BECAUSE...

- ▶ He is the founder and co-chairman of the city-wide Committee to Keep NY Habitable, which is fighting to keep the Highway Department from chopping off sidewalks. Bleecker Street is one of the Village streets where Ed is leading the preservation fight.
- ▶ He is currently working on plans with the Traffic Department to keep tourist buses off Macdougall Street and other narrow Village thoroughfares.
- ▶ He is working with city councilmen to create an independent civilian Police Complaint Board. Suggested by Ed two years ago, this idea is gaining wide approval among civic groups.
- ▶ He is fighting to keep Washington Square Park from being closed for two years of renovation and is also sounding out Federal officials on the possibility of making the Washington Arch a Federal monument.
- ▶ He won unanimous approval of the NY Democratic County Committee's executive committee for a resolution against the Broome St. Expressway.
- ▶ He is continuing to urge the Transit Authority to improve Fifth Avenue bus service. Among his suggestions are a free transfer plan so that Villagers living south of the Square can use either the uptown or downtown lines without walking great distances.

Last fall, the Democratic voters for the second time in two years rejected Carmine DeSapio's bid for a come-back. By a margin of 41 voters, they elected VID candidate Edward L. Koch District Leader of the First Assembly District South (Greenwich Village).

On May 7th, the State Court of Appeals ruled that there had been irregularities and that a new election must be held because 25 qualified voters failed to sign the registration book. Mr. De Sapio has hailed the decision as a "vindication". In fact, of course, it is nothing of the sort. The only people who can vindicate De Sapio are the voters--and they repudiated him in 1961 and 1963 and will undoubtedly do so this time, too...
