Dear Deputy Commissioner Mackay:

As elected officials representing the neighborhoods located in Manhattan's Community Board 2, we are writing regarding the Section 106 reviews of LinkNYC 5G towers.

Due to their size and design, we believe these 32-foot-tall towers should not be sited within or close enough to visually impact historic districts or individual landmarks in our area. Four LinkNYC 5G towers are currently planned for the West Village at 100 Horatio Street, 100 Jane Street, 771 Greenwich Street, and 445 West Street. Two additional towers have been announced at 100 Gansevoort Street and 807 Greenwich Street; these towers are being "remediated," which may mean they will be moved to locations close to their original sites.

All six of these towers are within or adjoining historic districts and individual landmarks. We believe the towers will negatively impact the historic character of these districts and landmarks, and urge that the SHPO find the towers will have adverse effects.

Thank you for your time and attention to this important issue.
