

Central America

VID was represented at the June 9th UN march and Times Sq. rally where giant puppets of Reagan, Kirkpatrick, Weinberger and Kissinger were put on trial for US interventionism in Central America. Tens of thousands marched and hundreds participated in a Civil Disobedience action on June 7th aimed at "stopping business as usual" at the offices of the FBI and CIA. VID was a co-sponsor of both events.

Nuclear Weapons Free Zones

On June 22nd, the NYC Council Environmental Protection Committee held hearings on Res. #364 which would prohibit "the production, transport, storage and deployment of nuclear weapons within the limits of NYC and declares NYC a NUCLEAR WEAPONS FREE ZONE." The resolution by Councilmember Abe Gerges was endorsed by VID as a tandem notion with Councilmember Miriam Friedlander's Res. #568 prohibiting cruise missiles, which the US Navy plans to station in Staten Island in 5 years. VID President Rick Braun testified in support of #364 as did District Leader Catherine Abate and State Committeemember Jerry Goldfeder.

Democratic National Convention

USOCA (United States Out of Central America) has contacted VID about its caravan to the Dem. Nat'l. Convention this month where it plans rallies, marches and cultural events against interventionism and for Peace. If you are interested in going to the Convention for \$238 r/t to L.A. Dear V.I.D. member:

We in the V.I.D. have fought for the protection of the civil rights of lesbians and gay men since the issue was first raised. All of our elected officials support such protections. As a consequence, we may feel that there's not much more we can do to help on the issue.

There is, however, much more that needs to be done in New York. This City is one of the few major American cities that does not protect gay rights despite the fact that we have the largest lesbian and gay population of any city in the world and the issue is supported by the public at large. This May 22nd, in fact, marked a sad anniversary in the struggle for gay rights. It was the tenth anniversary of the last time the City gay rights bill was even allowed a full vote in the Council. Since then, the homophobic Majority Leader, Tom Cuite, has kept the bill (Intro 1) bottled up in committee.

Right now, there is a "Free the Lesbian and Gay Rights Bill" campaign going on and we can help. Those of us represented by Council Members who support the bill can let them know that we want them to do more to press the issue. In addition, most of us have friends and relatives who live in areas represented by Council Members who are against Intro 1. We need to prevail upon them to write letters to their Council representatives demanding a positive vote on the bill.


If you know people who live in districts represented by negative votes, ask them to demand in writing a yes vote on a discharge motion to bring the bill to the floor and on the substance of the bill itself. A particularly key vote is that of Susan Alter, a new member of the General Welfare Committee, who represents the Flatbush/East Flatbush area. To find out who your representative is, call the League of Women Voters at 674-8484. Those wishing more information on the stand of a particular Council Member can call me at 302-0862.

The other thing that you can do is to get your church, synagogue, professional association, or other organization to endorse Intro 1 and to communicate that endorsement to the Coalition for Lesbian and Gay Rights, Box 1760, New York, NY 10163. (The V.I.D. is one of 50 groups represented in the Coalition.)


