Speakers from various perspectives discussed the opportunities for reform presented by the recent court decision finding the NYC Board of Estimate unconstitutional. This is an issue that touches on the very role and function of the Board, and the potential for empowering the City Council and local community boards. The reforms that are enacted may potentially affect city services, the judicial system, and local democracy. In response to the significance of this issue, as well as to the increasing allegations and revelations of government corruption and conflicts of interest, I have proposed the creation of a new VID committee - the Good Government Committee. Watch for its first meeting, to be listed on our calendar of events.

Speaking of democracy, if you're a registered democrat living in the 61st Assembly District (call us if you don't know), VID invites you - and urges you - to be a county committee candidate. The County Committee is the grassroots level of the NY Democratic Party. ## HUMAN RIGHTS COMMITTEE

The Human Rights Committee in conjunction with the Arts Committee has begun plans for a series of public forums to address the plight of artists. Tentatively titled "The Subversive Nature of Art," three public events will touch upon different aspects of this theme: the government suppression of jazz musicians in Prague and New York; denial of entry of artists and intellectuals in this country through the enforcement of the McCarren-Walter Act; and the Reagan Administration's ideological and financial assault upon public television and radio. In addition, the Human Rights Committee is considering hosting a public debate concerning surrogate parenting. It is hoped that this event will further sensitize people to the societal implications of this practice as well as to lead to some concrete form of public action.

Lastly, members of the Human Rights Committee have initiated discussions for other possible future campaigns of conscience, including discriminatory practices against AIDS victims, and the struggle of the homeless.


