

David Dinkins A Record of Commitment

David Dinkins has been a consistent advocate of basic civil rights for racial, ethnic and religious minorities. His longstanding support of the lesbian and gay community was demonstrated time and time again in the long struggle to pass the Lesbian and Gay Rights Bill in New York City.

Senseless violence, born of hate and fear, is escalating in our city. Lesbians and gay men are among the most frequent victims of bias-related violence. David Dinkins supports legislation to increase the penalties for bias-related crimes.

He believes the attitudes that lead to discrimination and violence can be changed through education and example. He has acted upon his conviction by appointing lesbians and gay men to significant positions in his own administration.

LESBIAN AND GAY RIGHTS BILL

- David Dinkins lobbied for and testified on behalf of the Lesbian and Gay Rights Bill, as City Clerk and as Manhattan Borough President.
- David Dinkins has opposed efforts to weaken this crucial legislation.
- David Dinkins supports a stronger Human Rights Commission to provide effective investigation of discrimination complaints.

AIDS

- David Dinkins provided seed money for the first citywide mass media AIDS education campaign. He funded community-based AIDS education, housing and service programs, and the expansion of the AIDS Discrimination Unit of the Human Rights Commission.
- David Dinkins organized the Upper Manhattan Task Force on AIDS and the Lower Manhattan AIDS Community Service Project.
- David Dinkins serves on the boards of directors of several AIDS organizations, including AIDS FILMS and the Black Leadership Commission on AIDS.
- David Dinkins has fought to include people who are HIV-ill in the city's housing and social services programs. As Mayor, he will increase

housing and services for people with AIDS.

BIAS-RELATED VIOLENCE

- David Dinkins has consistently supported the bias-related violence legislation pending in the New York State legislature.
- David Dinkins has promoted the inclusion of gay history and culture in school curricula to combat the increasing intolerance against lesbians and gay men.
- David Dinkins supports the use of community mediation to prevent incidents of bias-related violence.
- David Dinkins advocates the establishment of a completely independent Civilian Complaint Review Board.

DOMESTIC PARTNERSHIPS

- David Dinkins supports legislation pertaining to city employees that recognizes domestic partnerships.
- David Dinkins is the only known agency official to recognize domestic partnerships among his own staff.
- David Dinkins supports parental rights for lesbians and gay men in adoption and foster care.

HEALTH CARE

WHY VOTERS FLED ED

Fed up with city ills, Dems got a new doc

David Dinkins captured the Democratic mayoral primary yesterday with overwhelming support from an electorate that was fed up with drugs, homelessness, corruption, racial tension and Ed Koch, according to the Daily News/Eyewitness News Exit Poll.

Two-thirds of those surveyed said they believed the overall quality of life in the city had declined in the last few years, and of that group, six in 10 said they voted for Dinkins.

Those surveyed picked drugs as the city's biggest problem (52%), followed by crime in the streets (49%), homelessness (28%), corruption in the Koch administration (14%) and racial tension (12%).

The men split the vote among those listing drugs as the No. 1 problem in the city and Koch had a 5-to-4 margin among those listing crime as the major problem. But Dinkins had a 3-to-2 edge among voters rating homelessness as No. 1, and a 3-to-1 tally among those who consider corruption the worst problem. Voters who rated racial tensions as the city's top problem favored Dinkins by more than 2 to 1.

Koch was politically battered by voters upset over his personality and behavior in public as well as corruption in his administration. Thirty-one per cent cited personality and public behavior as reasons for voting for a particular candidate, and of that group Dinkins bested Koch by a 5-to-4 margin.

The numbers were even worse for Koch among the 29% who said corruption during his administration was a key to their selection, with Dinkins winning that subcategory by nearly a 10-to-1 margin.

Conversely, Koch won the support of 72% of those who cited Dinkins' tax problems as part of their selection process. But only 14% of those surveyed listed that issue as important. Koch also did well with the elderly, retirees, Jews and rich people, but it was far from enough.

The poll showed Dinkins garnered widespread support in the black

community — about 90% — and among Hispanics and Latinos by more than 5 to 4. But his support among white voters, about three in 10, proved pivotal and showed that the election was not decided simply along racial lines.

More than one in 10 of those surveyed selected the Bensonhurst racial situation as an important issue in their choice for mayor, and of that group, more than 70% said they voted for Dinkins.

The Manhattan borough president did especially well with women voters, besting Koch by more than a 5-to-4 margin.

Voters who made up their minds in the closing week of the campaign split along the same lines as the final vote, indicating that neither candidate made any inroads in the closing days.

But the deciding factors appeared to be quality-of-life issues and dissatisfaction with Koch. About one in five surveyed said it was time for a change, and of those feeling that way, nine out of 10 said they voted for Dinkins.

About 8% of those surveyed said they voted for the candidate they felt was most sensitive to their needs, and of that group, nearly 90% said they voted for Dinkins. Of those who said they most liked their candidate's fairness to all groups, three out of four voted for Dinkins.

City workers supported Dinkins by a nearly 2-to-1 margin and he won the union-household vote by more than 3 to 2.


